Making a Difference One Boy at a Time Jake is Moving On

Jake shakes his head and grins broadly. He has no idea why he got into so much trouble while living with his family. His parents and older brother were honest, caring people. Maybe there wasn't enough structure, or real consequences? Certainly his choice of companions and peer pressure were factors. Regardless, Jake clearly was into trouble. Drugs, theft and property damage were all part of his repertoire. He had anger issues and rarely attended school.

Fortunately he was bright enough to know he needed help, and Huron House Boys' Home seemed to offer a solution.

Jake is proud of his turn around. He has a perfect attendance record at Alexander Mackenzie Secondary School, has good grades and is involved with their Goodwill program.

Jake isn't exactly sure where to assign credit for his success. He learned from the weekly group meetings. He appreciated the long talks with his primary workers; they helped him recognize the probable outcomes of different choices. He thought the empathy program was a very wise initiative. But he glows when he talks about working at community jobs. Come to think of it, the work ethic he brought with him was a big factor in his success. It really paid off on community jobs, where his hard work led to an enviable bank account balance.

Jake responded well to the structure and guidance of Huron House. At present he is living in the in-house apartment and thriving in the Independent Living Program. He'll take important lessons with him when he graduates from grade 12 in June and moves to living independently in his home community. He already has a permanent part time job lined up.

Jake is happy, optimistic, and feeling great about his future. We couldn't be happier for him!

Believe it or not I have been here a year, and what a year! The more I see of this community, the more I love it. I have been able to see our famous Run/Walk/Skate/Bike and our spectacular "Men who Cook" gala. I have been able to speak to various groups, e.g. Kiwanis, Optimists, and churches. Each event reinforces the fantastic community support for the Boys' Home, which is greatly appreciated.

We have implemented significant therapeutic programming at the Boys' Home, have hired a part time psychologist, have reworked our Policies and Procedures and are embarking on the process to be re-accredited as a Children's Mental Health Facility.

Additionally the system is changing. While the majority of our youth come from Sarnia, boys from across southwestern Ontario are being placed with us as other resources are being closed.
