Huron House Boys' Home was established as an agency in 1970 by a group of concerned citizens from Sarnia who saw a need for a safe, warm, and homelike environment for teenaged boys. The positive response from the community was so great that in 1972 a 12-member volunteer Board of Directors incorporated the agency to form Youth Services of Lambton County Inc., commonly known as Huron

House Boys' Home. The Board of Directors immediately purchased the 10-acre property known as Our Lady of Sorrows Junior Seminary, which they had been leasing from the Catholic Diocese of London.

Huron House is now accredited as a Children's Mental Health Centre with an excellent staff and diverse and unique

programs. Since its inception, Huron House Boys' Home has helped more than 1,000 boys. They have grown into strong and community-minded men who have found success as teachers, principals, child care workers, engineers, and mechanics as well as in business and many other careers.

From the Executive Director...

There are many challenges being faced by Lambton County Children's Mental Health Service providers currently. Funding is by far the biggest one. The Core Services group of Children's Mental Health Service providers

(lead agency St. Clair Child and Youth Services, Rebound, Sarnia Lambton Community Living, Family Counselling Centre, and Huron House) are trying to reconfigure our system so that crisis services are available 24/7 but CANNOT do so without more funding unless current services are cut. Residential Children's Mental Health services may be cut/reduced!

Ontario Health Teams are being established in each community to look at priorities, but no one knows



what this will look like, especially for Children's Mental Health.

Having said all that, we continue to be supported by our GREAT community and are pleased that Blackburn Radio has offered to partner with us on their CHOK Bridge Race

since the YMCA has withdrawn. Thank you Blackburn Radio.

Additionally, Huron House will be celebrating its 50th year in 2020, a HUGE milestone. We couldn't have done this without the great and ongoing support from our community.
