Life at the Boys' Home

Over the past few months, we've had three boys graduate and three new boys move in, so there are still ten boys living at Huron House. Two boys are participating in our Independent Living Program where they are given more autonomy and are learning skills like menu planning, budgeting, and cooking.

The boys have adjusted well to being back in school and on top of their happiness about the end of virtual schooling, they are enjoying being able to participate in extracurriculars and other in-person, out of the house activities again.

What does a day at Huron House look like?

An average weekday at Huron House starts with breakfast and then off to school. After school usually means free time or sessions with our clinician, and after dinner our evenings vary between therapeutic art, recreation, and life-skills groups and then packing lunches and getting ready for the next day. Weekends include more free time and chores that range from yard work to room cleaning and laundry.

Boys in our Independent Living Program follow a similar schedule but are also responsible for preparing their own meals.

How to make the most of your donation

It might be a cliché, but small amounts of dollars really do add up to make a big difference. If you haven't contemplated becoming a monthly donor before, we encourage you to think about it, and consider how much of an impact it can have on a teenage boy who needs our mental health supports.

Benefits to Huron House

- We're able to more accurately predict our monthly income and plan for upcoming expenses.
- It keeps our administrative costs lower.

Benefits to you

- It breaks up your investment into a more manageable amount. It's easier to not miss \$10 each month than \$120 at once.
- Take something off your to-do list. Set it and forget it and don't have any end-of-year worry about whether or not you've made your donations.
- It's flexible. Stop or change it whenever you need. Option to choose cumulative or monthly tax receipts.

So what could your monthly gift do?

- \$10- one month of toiletries for a boy
- \$25—one month of school snacks for a boy

\$50– supplies for one month of therapeutic group programs

\$100—one month of counselling sessions for a boy

How do you set it up?

Visit our secure form at <u>hhbh.ca/</u> <u>monthly</u> and choose your donation amount, how often you would like to receive your tax receipts, and provide your contact information. That's it. You'll receive a confirmation email and be good to go!

Future donations will be taken on the same day of the month as your first monthly transaction, so pick whatever day works best for you.
