The event has become a tradition for so many families, with father and child teams signing up year after year to celebrate Father's Day together. We have others who participate in honour of loved ones who have passed on, like the families of Andre Morin and Pete Fisher, two dedicated Huron House volunteers who are greatly missed. In recent survey of participants who have been coming out for multiple years, their top reason for coming back each year is the cause and wanting to support Huron House, with the atmosphere and lakeside routes coming a close second.

We welcome everyone in the community to come and see what the event is about. We have participants of all ages— in last year's virtual event they ranged from 2 to 86. Even if you don't participate, come cheer on those who are! A big pancake and sausage

breakfast is available for free for all registered participants, and for just \$5 for everyone else.

Why is Run/Walk/Skate/Bike such a big deal to Huron House? This is our largest annual fundraising event and funds are used to support all aspects of our operations. Message from the Executive Director



Hello, and thank you! I started as the Executive Director at Huron House in December 2021, also known as the

boys' home, HHBH, and several other acronyms for those who don't know. Amongst all those names, though, one thing has been made very clear to me in the short time I've spent here: the people of Bright's Grove, Sarnia, Point Edward, and all the surrounding communities are some of the most caring and giving people I have ever encountered.

Traditionally, the boys' home was a refuge for troubled male youth.

However, over the past fifteen years, the needs of the youth have significantly expanded. As a result, Huron House continues to work with youth with behavioral challenges; though, most of those living at Huron House have significant mental health, developmental delays, autism, and trauma needs. Our staff team is highly trained and develops specialized, individualized programming (SIP) for each youth. This SIP program, in conjunction with our community partners, allows us to offer an unparalleled level of quality service.

What does the future hold? Please keep your eyes and ears open as we move forward into the post COVID

era; Huron House will be unveiling new programming and improvements to allow this new vision to become a reality. Over the next year, our team's goal is to develop a STEM lab, respite services, play therapy, animal therapy, horticultural therapy, and explore traditional health practices. These are a few of the new and innovative that will continue to strengthen our program and community.

I look forward to leading Huron House and especially look forward to working with such a supportive, generous and caring community!

We've had two more boys join us since the start of the year and another has moved up to join our Independent Living Program (ILP), so we now have eight boys living on our main floor, plus three in ILP. We are regularly reviewing referrals from organizations in Lambton County and across Ontario and will likely have more joining us in the coming weeks.

The boys have been enjoying getting back to a more "normal" life and getting out for things like Sting games, bowling, District Beta, and other activities out in the community. The summer will bring more fun, like trips to the beach and bike rides down the Howard Watson Trail.

Planned Giving Made Simple

Huron House has been the recent recipient of several generous bequests and gifts of securities, so we've put together some information to share how simple planned giving can be to help you get started if it's something you're considering. In addition to the well-known bequests, some other types of planned gifts are:

Gift of Life Insurance

Open a new policy, or update a current one, make Huron House beneficiary and receive an annual tax receipt for premiums paid, plus know you're leaving a large gift when the policy is paid out.

Gift of Securities

Donate stocks, bonds, mutual funds or other securities, get a tax receipt right away, plus don't pay any gains taxes.

Gift of Real Estate

Donate a property and get a tax receipt for the appraised market value, plus pay either reduced or zero gains taxes depending on the situation.

Gift of RRSPs/RRIFs

Indicate Huron House as the beneficiary for all or a percentage of any un-used portions of your RRSP or RRIF with no costs to your estate.

Why consider a planned gift?

Maximizing your impact on a cause that matters to you

Wills are more than a legal formality, they can be a powerful tool for change in the world. A gift that may not seem like a lot now can mature and provide more than you might think.

Tax Benefits

Bequests don't have to compete with providing for family members, you can easily do both and reduce the taxes that need to be paid on the estate. Other methods of planned giving can offer you tax benefits right away.

Flexibility

A bequest can be for any specific amount, percentage or residue of your estate, and you can adjust any time.

Cost-effective

There are no, or very small extra out-ofpocket costs. Your current income won't be affected.
